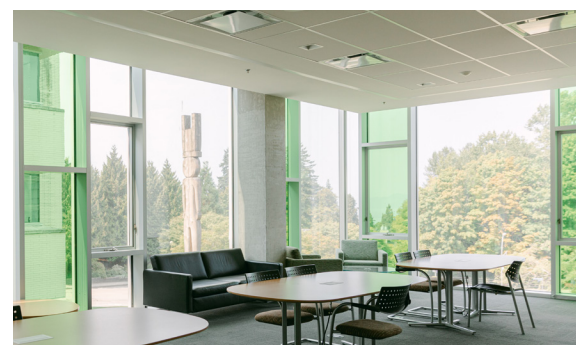

RESEARCH STRENGTHS & FACILITIES

The Allard School of Law is home to some of Canada's top legal scholars and professors and has a long history of outstanding graduate legal education. The law school has particular research strengths in Indigenous and Aboriginal Law, Asian legal studies, business law, environmental and natural resource law, feminist legal studies, and human rights. Our graduate students pursue doctrinal and interdisciplinary legal scholarship both in Canadian and international spheres.

Built in 2011, Allard Hall is a beautiful, light-filled 141,000 square foot building that houses a three-story library containing research materials from all of the major common law jurisdictions, civil law materials from Quebec (in English and French), comparative and international law materials, and comprehensive access to electronic databases.

Resources for graduate students include an embedded counsellor, dedicated graduate program staff, and an exclusive study and social space. Volunteer opportunities include the Law Students Legal Advice Program, Pro Bono Students Canada, executive positions on the Graduate Law Student Society, and a diverse array of student clubs and clinics offering a robust suite of lectures and networking opportunities.
